



## RHPS Language Challenges

<p>Monday 25<sup>th</sup> January <b>Who are you?</b></p> <p>Can you teach someone at home how to say hello and give their name in the target language? What else can you teach them to say?</p>	<p>Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> January <b>Scavenger hunt</b></p> <p>Find as many colours as you can in your house/garden/ during a socially distanced walk. As an extension you can name each object you find in the target language.</p>	<p>Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> January <b>Bust-a-move</b></p> <p>Learn a well-known song/dance such as 'Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes' or the 'Hokey Cokey' in the target language.</p>	<p>Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> January <b>Vocabulary snap</b></p> <p>Choose a topic to focus on in the language you are learning e.g. colours, food, numbers etc. Make a set of cards which have the word written in the target language and either a picture to match or the word written in English. (You could also find a set to print online.) You could use the cards to play pairs as well!</p>	<p>Friday 29<sup>th</sup> January 2021 <b>Counting Challenge</b></p> <p>Practise counting in the language you are learning at school. Choose an activity – you could skip, jump, hop on one leg, do star jumps- and count how many of these you can do in one minute.</p>
<p>Monday 1<sup>st</sup> February 2021 <b>Months of the year poster</b></p> <p>Can you create a poster for the months of the year in the target language? You can even use this to make a calendar for this year!</p>	<p>Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2021 <b>Plan a meal</b></p> <p>Can you plan a meal in the target language? Label the foods needed to make the meal. You can even practise saying whether you like/dislike the foods.</p>	<p>Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2021 <b>Family Tree</b></p> <p>Can you create a family tree in the target language to show the people in your family?</p>	<p>Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> February 2021 <b>What's the Weather like?</b></p> <p>Can you make a mobile to show the different types of weather? You can use the mobile to explain what the weather is like to someone at home.</p>	<p>Friday 5<sup>th</sup> February <b>Lotto</b></p> <p>Draw a grid with 6 boxes. Choose 6 numbers between 1-10 (or 10-20/40-60 etc) in the language you are learning. Write one number in each box. Take it in turns for one person to be the caller. The caller says the number in the target language. If you have the number on your grid, cross it out. The first person to cross out all of their numbers is the winner.</p>
